
SCHOLARSHIP/STUDENT AGREEMENT – ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER DEGREE

MBUILD - MASTER DEGREE IN SUSTAINABLE DESIGN, CONSTRUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

University of Porto, established in Praça Gomes Teixeira, 4099-002, Porto, Portugal, represented by its Rector, Professor António de Sousa Pereira, through its Faculty of Engineering, placed at Rua Dr. Roberto Frias, s/n, 4200 – 465 Porto, represented by its Dean, Professor João Falcão e Cunha, hereafter referred both to as “the Institution”, as First Signatory, and

hereafter referred to as “the Student/Scholarship Holder”, the Second Signatory, celebrate this Agreement under the following terms and conditions:

1. This Agreement regulates the rights and obligations of the parties concerning the EMJ Master Degree in Sustainable Design, Construction and Management of the Built Environment (MBUILD) to be delivered according to the study plan and individualized study track attached as Annex 1 and the rights and obligations of the parties concerning the attribution of an ERASMUS + scholarship to the Student/Scholarship Holder by the Coordinating Institution.
 2. The MBUILD Master is organized by three Institutions: University of Porto (UPORTO); Universidad de Cantabria (UC); and Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (THM), which constitute the MBUILD Consortium. The Coordinating Institution of this Consortium is the University of Porto.
 3. The MBUILD Master programme is financed by the European Commission Erasmus+ Programme, under the Grant Agreement (GA) N° 101051004, within the topic ERASMUS-EDU-2021-PEX-EMJM-MOB - Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters.
 4. In respect to the present Agreement, the Student/Scholarship Holder commits to:
 - a. Comply with the internal regulations of the Consortium Institutions and with national legislation of the countries of the Consortium Institutions;
 - b. Attend the MBUILD master courses, classes and all the activities assiduously with the objective of successfully completing the predefined coursework and examinations inherent to the programme of studies;
 - c. Organize its travel plans considering the calendar of the Consortium University where he/she is staying and the general calendar of the Master Programme to avoid arriving late or departing before all the academic activities have ended;
 - d. Fulfil all the administrative requirements established by the **MBUILD** Coordinating Institution and the partner Universities by the due dates;
 - e. Participate in surveys and/or evaluations conducted by the Coordinating Institution, partner universities and/or the European Commission;
 - f. Complete the mobility periods foreseen in the MBUILD Master and mentioned in Annex 1, according to which the 1st semester will take place at the University of Porto (UPORTO); the 2nd semester will take place at Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen (THM); the 3rd semester will take place at Universidad de Cantabria (UC); and the 4th semester will take place at any of the Partner Universities with the possibility of voluntary periods of internships while doing the final dissertation, according to the theme and supervision chosen by the Student and if allowed by the applicable visa legislation. The procedure to the submission and defense of the dissertation will follow

11. If the Student/Scholarship Holder, for reasons accepted by the Coordinating Institution after consultation with the Granting Authority, does not comply with the minimum mobility requirements, the Scholarship amount mentioned in number 8. will be reduced proportionally to the missing mobility period of the concerned academic semester.
12. The Student/Scholarship Holder, during the period of the scholarship, will not bear costs with tuition fees and insurance coverage necessary for the completion of the MBUILD Master, or costs with issuing the final certificate of the MBUILD Master. Costs with any other academic certificates requested by the Student/Scholarship Holder are his/her's sole responsibility.
13. The financial support of the MBUILD Consortium is limited to the amounts mentioned in this Agreement. If these amounts are not sufficient, there will be no additional financial support by the MBUILD Consortium. The Student/Scholarship Holder is solely responsible for the costs incurred with accommodation, travel (including travel costs necessary for the compliance with the mobility requirements), visa, subsistence costs and any other costs necessary for the completion of the MBUILD Master.
14. The Scholarship and the Scholarship payments will be suspended if the Student/Scholarship Holder is forced to temporarily interrupt his/her studies, following duly justified and documented reasons accepted by the Coordinating Institution after consultation with the Granting Authority. The Student acknowledges that, depending on the duration of the interruption of studies, his/her registration in the Master might be annulled, with the possibility of a future readmission. The scholarship payments may be resumed afterwards provided that the project end date (31/12/2027) has not been reached. Payments after this date are not possible.
15. This Scholarship does not create or entitle an employer - employee relation between any of the Consortium Institutions and the Student/Scholarship Holder.
16. In respect for the present Agreement, the Coordinating Institution, on behalf of the MBUILD Consortium Institutions, commits to:
 - a. Deliver the master programme as described in the proposal approved by the European Commission;
 - b. Ensure that the Student/Scholarship Holder is adequately supervised within the scope of the MBUILD Master, with reasonable care and skill;
 - c. Ensure that the appropriate learning conditions are made available to the Student/Scholarship Holder so that he/she may undertake the planned activities;
 - d. Ensure appropriate monitoring of the progress of the mobility period and also that reasonable support is provided to the Student/Scholarship Holder throughout his/her stay in regards to administrative aspects and his/her integration in the Consortium Institutions, including VISA requirements;
 - e. Publish all relevant information concerning the structure and organization of the Master course, its academic calendar and course's outline in the website of the Master course prior to the start of the academic year;
 - f. Follow transparent and equal examination and degree awarding processes;
 - g. Offer an appropriate health and accident insurance scheme, according to the requirements of the Erasmus + Programme;
 - h. Offer to the Student/Scholarship Holder three foreign language courses: one in Portuguese, one in German and one in Spanish to be held at each of the Consortium Institutions or online (provided that the Student/Scholarship Holder is not fluent in these local languages);
 - i. Guarantee the award of the Masters Certificate and the appropriate Diploma Supplement, if the Student/Scholarship Holder successfully completes the programme;
 - j. Organize a welcome session in the beginning of each of the three first semesters in each of the three Consortium Institutions, to familiarize Students and Scholarship Holders with the master programme, the university services and the city;
 - k. Ensure adequate treatment for Student/Scholarship Holder with disabilities;
 - l. Ensure an adequate treatment of all complaints, according to the applicable regulations/legislations in the Consortium Institutions;
 - m. Encourage the Student/Scholarship Holder to join the ERASMUS Mundus Students and Alumni Association.
17. Should the Student/Scholarship Holder successfully complete the full academic track, corresponding to a total of 120 ECTS, he/she will be awarded with a Joint Master Diploma, issued by U.Porto on behalf of the partner Universities.
The Student/Scholarship Holder shall also be provided with a Diploma Supplement describing the details of the

academic track.

18. The Student/Scholarship Holder understands that he/she shall be excluded from the MBUILD master programme:
 - a. If the Student/Scholarship Holder is subject to disciplinary measures leading to his/her exclusion from the MBUILD Consortium Universities;
 - b. If the Student/Scholarship Holder is subject to legal prosecution that prevents him/her from attending the MBUILD Master;
 - c. If the Student/Scholarship Holder was selected based on previous false declarations, which led to the misidentification of his/her eligibility to participate in the master programme;
 - d. In case of proven plagiarism or cheating.
19. The exclusion from the MBUILD Master will be decided according to the applicable law/regulations. The Student/Scholarship Holder may, according to the applicable law/regulations, appeal this decision.
20. The Coordinating Institution will comply with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data.
21. Personal data (including data in mobility declaration) of the Student/Scholarship Holder will be collected, processed and transferred between the Consortium Institutions and the European Commission, acting as granting authority. Regarding the European Commission, the Portal Privacy Statement is available at <https://erasmus-plus.ec.europa.eu/erasmus-and-data-protection/privacy-statement-mobility-tool>.
22. Intellectual Property rights (copyright, industrial property, industrial designs and trademarks) obtained under the MBUILD Master will comply with the Regulation of Intellectual Property of: i) the University of Porto, published in "Diário da República, Série II, n.º 242", on 20/12/2005, ii) Universidad de Cantabria, published in Real Decreto Legislativo 1/1996 (copyright), Ley 24/2015 de 24 (patents and utility models), Ley 20/2003 (industrial designs) and Ley 17/2001 (trademarks), and iii) Technische Hochschule Mittelhessen, Federal Law on Copyright and Related Rights of 09.09.1965, last amended by Law of 23.06.2021 (UrhG §§ 1-143) and Patent Law, in the version of the announcement of 16.12.1980, last amended by Law of 30.08.2021 (PatG §§ 1 - 147).
23. Any modification to this Agreement or its Annexes must be done in the form of an Addendum, being signed by all Parties who signed the original Agreement.
24. Any conflict arising from this agreement should be brought to the attention of the Coordinating Institution. The conflict should be solved by mutual agreement among the Parties.
25. If all attempts to solve the conflict amicably fail, all legal matters arising from the present agreement will be regulated by the Portuguese law.
26. The Consortium Institutions are exonerated from any responsibility for accidents, illnesses, injuries, losses or damages to persons or goods resulting from or in any way related to the activities that are the object of this Agreement.

ANNEX 2 – STUDENT ASSESSMENT SYSTEM AND GRADING CONVERSION

1. MBUILD student accomplishment will be evaluated through course examinations and Masters dissertation.
2. Students will be marked according to the score given in each of the examinations. A global Masters’ score will also be awarded. The marks are given in the grading system of the host university and via the translation table shown below to the common grading system:

3. The Masters will be successfully completed when all courses are passed, including the Dissertation. It will be graded according to the score given in each course. The final grade of the programme will be the average of each course’s grade weighted by its corresponding ECTS.
Students shall successfully pass course examinations to complete each of the Masters courses. Course examinations may consist of several partial examinations.
4. Students may take each course examinations twice (ordinary and extraordinary examination) during the academic term in which the course is programmed.
5. The Masters Dissertation theme will be decided by the Masters Academic/Selection Committee, taking into account Student’s preferences, possible Internship content and Student’s profile. The Academic/Selection Committee decision can be appealed before the Executive Committee and further, according to the applicable legislation.
6. Internships are optional and possible if allowed by the applicable visa legislation and, in the case that the students has followed an internship, the theme for the dissertation can be defined in accordance to student’s preferences, perspective of the entity where the internship was carried and academic requirements. In this case, the dissertation will be co-supervised by a tutor (at least with a MSc degree), from the entity where the internship was developed.
7. The Masters Dissertation shall be submitted according to the schedule defined by the Coordinating Institution for the year in which the student shall be completing the Masters course, expected to occur before the last week of July.
8. The Master Dissertation will be evaluated by a panel of Professors composed and appointed according to the internal rules of the Coordinating Institution.
